A Message From The Pastor:

A CHANGE IN PLANS

Have you ever found yourself stranded in some bus terminal, train station, or airport as all your travel plans fell completely apart? Maybe the weather forced a delay. Or perhaps a computer error lost your reservation. Sometimes, for reasons you never understand, the flight just got cancelled. You planned well in advance, and attended to all the details, but something went terribly wrong.

But travel isn't the only thing that forces a change of plans. You might even say that complications are a metaphor for life itself. Someone once said that life is what happens while you are waiting for something else. There are all sorts of inconveniences. Unexpected. Unavoidable. And they may change the rest of our lives. Things like sickness, reorganizations, layoffs and (eventually) even death. Life is a perpetual compromise between the ideal and the possible.

Our eventual success or failure typically depends on how we respond to such changes in plans. We can rage against God, bad luck, other people, the organization or fate. We can have a "pity party" and lament our victimhood. We can accept changing circumstances as a challenge and learn to "improvise, adapt and overcome." But if we are people of faith, we need to consider the larger context. A "happenstance" might just be a hidden message.

Sometimes God uses circumstances to show us our need, to remind us that our supposed control is just an illusion. Perhaps to draw us closer and teach us to lean on His resources. Or maybe to use those "closed doors" to point us in an entirely new direction. That, for example, is how God led me to become a Navy chaplain!

The New Testament book of Acts offers a profound example of such guidance. Verses six through ten of chapter sixteen describe how the Apostle Paul attempted to take his ministry north into the province of Asia, but was "prevented by the Holy Spirit." Next, he turned toward the province of Bithynia, but that opportunity was denied as well. Finally, in a vision, he saw a man from Macedonia begging "Come over and help us." So he accepted that call and headed west, to the Balkan peninsula.

That account records one of the most important events in the history of the Christian Church. It was at that point that the Gospel was first carried out of Asia Minor (which would later fall to the followers of Islam) and into Europe, which would preserve and propagate it throughout the world. There was no way Paul could have anticipated that impact. But he submitted himself to God's bigger vision, changed his plans, and the rest is history.

Life usually doesn't give us our first preference. There are many detours, delays and disruptions. Sooner or later we are all forced to make "course corrections." Those changes may even test our faith. We should never discount, however, the possibility of a larger message. Disappointment and failure may just lead to possibilities we could never have imagined. That is, if we are open to God's leading. Hold out for the best.



The First Baptist Church of Damascus, VA sits on a famous thoroughfare, as the Appalachian Trail follows the sidewalk leading to the front door. This congregation works year-round to pack Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, but they lost everything when a raging creek swept through their sanctuary.

As church members dealt with the muddy devastation, they also grieved for the lost opportunity to share the joy of Christmas with children on the other side of the world. Then the nearby Glade Spring Baptist Church stepped up, mobilizing neighbors to pack hundreds of additional shoeboxes, making sure that no children would be left out. "We went from devastation to celebration," said Angie Fritz, a church member in Damascus.

Shoebox gifts from a mountain church might seem like a drop in the bucket, but it all adds up. We're still counting all the boxes we've collected through Operation Christmas Child, but it looks like we'll have enough to reach 12 million children around the world. Praise God for His mighty works!

Wherever Samaritan's Purse is working, whether we're preparing shoebox gifts or patching roofs, our priority is to share the hope we have in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, who came from Heaven to deliver us from our sins. "And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21).

The First Baptist Church in Spruce Pine, NC, embraced Operation Christmas Child as a missions outreach that is also an opportunity for healing. "When people hurt, the best medicine is giving," Pastor Rocky Branch said. The church has been a lifeline for the people of Spruce Pine, where the downtown was wiped out by flooding. The church cranked up its generator to provide the only lights in town, served over 40,000 meals, and turned its sanctuary into a pantry. In the midst of its relief work, the church packed and collected thousands of shoebox gifts for Operation Christmas Child. (Our own Haide Corchado served in Spruce Pine with Baptists on Mission. One of her tasks was building Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes).

After such a stormy year, Christmas brings good news: "And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. Then the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord'" (Luke 2:9-11).

Will you and I step into 2025 with boldness, unafraid of what the future might bring? Can we pack 700 gospel opportunities? I think we can, by the grace of God!

In **January**, be on the lookout for Christmas items on the clearance aisle. Winter clothing of all kinds is appreciated.
