#### A Message From The Pastor:

"It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year"

So proclaims one favorite song as it describes the coming of this Christmas season. Already, preparations have begun. Soon, offices will close, parking lots will empty, and highways will be filled with families headed home for the holidays. But what about those whose hopes and plans just can't measure up? Those recovering from the devastation of Hurricane Helene with its loss of possessions, vanished homes or even missing family members. Those languishing in hospitals or nursing homes. Those serving the country in faraway places. Or simply alone.

It can be a depressing time of year when your dreams have no chance of coming true. If you ever find yourself in that situation (and most of us will at some point), take heart. You aren't alone. Sometimes we look for more in a holiday than was ever there to begin with. Sometimes we expect festivities to give us what only God can. Our aloneness might even offer us the opportunity to rediscover the real meaning of Christmas. Sometimes our emptiness can lead us not just to the baby in a manger, but to the Lord of our life as well. And if we are fortunate enough to have each other, I remember the words of a former commanding officer of the USS FRANK CABLE who once advised, "Treasure each other; everything else is just stuff."

Christmas of 1944 was also lonely for many. Chaplain Robert Costner (the father of two of my college classmates) was "somewhere in England" with the 486<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group. His words, in a letter to soldiers that Christmas season, are as relevant today as in that world nearly a century away:

"The real meaning of Christmas is given in the announcement of the angels to the shepherds: "Fear not, for I bring you good tidings of great joy which shall be to all people; for unto you is born this day in the city of David a savior, which is Christ the Lord. How harshly and out of tune does that Bethlehem chorus of 'Peace on earth, goodwill to men' seem today. And yet it is no more out of tune today than when it was first uttered. ...

"The babe born in Bethlehem that night has given to the world an ideal... which will not let us rest until, by the grace of God, we have achieved it.... Let us rededicate ourselves to the cause of Him who first set the world to hoping for peace and righteousness and love. ... We have seen Him with the eyes of faith. Let us arise and follow after Him."

May it be so. And may each of you have a blessed Christmas. - Pastor Dave

Lottie Moon Christmas Offering--- The 2024 Lottie Moon Christmas Offering theme is "the Great Pursuit". This theme reflects the idea that missionaries are part of a global effort to share the Gospel with those whom have not yet heard it.

#### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT LOTTIE MOON:

- 1—Lottie was born in Virginia on December 12, 1840.
- 2—Her name was Charlotte Diggers Moon, but everyone called her "Lottie".
- 3--She stood a very tall 4'9".
- 4—Lottie loved to pull pranks on others.
- 5—Lottie was appointed to China as a missionary at age 33 and served there for 39 years, primarily in Tengchow and Pingtu.
- 6--She wore Chinese clothes and lived like her Chinese neighbors.
- 7—Lottie had several nicknames in China—foreign devil, foreign lady teacher, heavenly book visitor, and the cookie maker. Lottie baked cookies to win the hearts of the children and families who were frightened of her.

  8—Lottie led in the campaign to end the practice of
- 8—Lottle led in the campaign to end the practice of bound feet. Girls with bound feet could hardly walk, infections, gangrene, and even death were common side effects of this practice.
- 9—In 1912, at the end of her career, famine, flood, and war encircled her China. Her friends were starving. In a final act of empathy, Lottie stopped eating and gave all her food away. When her friends realized the depth of her sickness, they put her on a boat to return to the United States. Lottie died on Christmas Eve while en route to the United States.

Because of Lottie's determination, WMU collected a Christmas offering to give to the Foreign Mission Board.

In1918, at Annie Armstrong's suggestion, WMU named the offering for Lottie Moon. We still give to the LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS OFFERING in honor of her work and sacrifice to keep our missionaries of the field. 100% of the LMCO goes to support the missionaries.

#### **GLOBAL INFLUENCE OF OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

Who delivers shoebox gifts?

Operation Christmas Child is a global program facilitated through hundreds of thousands of trained volunteers. Local believers in more than 170 countries deliver shoebox gifts, present the Gospel, and facilitate our follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey. With this approach, local

Christians who know the culture and language best are given effective resources with a solid biblical foundation to share the Gospel in their communities. We equip ministry partners—local pastors or church leaders—to be our volunteer representatives by providing thorough, detailed training for them to be able to facilitate a shoebox outreach event and present the Gospel. Trained National Leadership Team (NLT) members, ministry partners, and The Greatest Journey teachers are volunteer roles filled exclusively by these national Christians.

#### How do shoebox gifts impact local economies?

In each shoebox receiving country, we partner with a NLT that consists of year-round volunteers from various church denominations. Together, they strategize how to reach children in their country with the Gospel. It is our desire to give one shoebox to a child in his or her lifetime, and this is the model used in our training. Local churches distribute shoebox gifts to children in different communities each year to avoid giving the same children gifts year after year. Because of this strategy, the economic impact on a community is minimal and allows us to reach millions of new children every year with the Good News of Jesus Christ. According to Henry Manthanamba, OCC prayer coordinator in Malawi, "If shoebox gifts impacted our local economy negatively, the government would never allow them. They see it as a blessing to the children of Malawi."

#### How are different cultures incorporated into shoebox distribution events?

More than 81,000 pastors and church leaders share the Gospel every year at outreach events where shoebox gifts are delivered. The shoebox outreach events are planned and implemented by volunteers in the local church who know the culture and language best. Through our volunteer NLT, local believers are trained to present the Gospel in a child friendly way. We work with the volunteer NLT to develop an annual strategy for evangelism, discipleship, and multiplication of believers and churches in their communities.

#### Do children have to say or do anything to receive a shoebox gift?

Shoebox gifts are given to children regardless of their gender, ethnicity, or faith. Children do not have to do or say anything to receive the gifts. We work in and through local Christians in each country who understand the context in their area. Simple gifts—packed with love in Jesus' Name—deliver hope and joy to children all around the world, regardless of their faith or religious background.

#### How does a shoebox gift impact a child in need?

Operation Christmas Child is not intended as a solution for meeting physical needs, but rather a strategy for the local church to meet spiritual needs of children in their communities. The unexpected gift delights and sparks hope in the life of a child as they hear of Jesus' love for them. Shoebox gifts are given freely in Jesus' Name.

19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

**December shoebox needs: Pray** for the safe delivery of the boxes to the processing centers, to the ports and airfields, and to the in-country volunteers who will distribute the boxes. And, please pray for the safety of the hundreds of volunteers across the country who will be traveling to the eight processing centers to sort and prepare for shipping the shoeboxes. Most especially pray for the hearts of the children that will hear the gospel for the first time that they will accept Jesus as their personal Savior.
